### Report on National Security: Alonzo McQueen

At any one time, 22,000 National Guard or Reserves troops are deployed to respond to the Nations rising operational demands. Wars in Europe and Southwest Asia, and rising tensions in Korea and the Pacific require the frequent deployment of the Guard and Reserves. Further, a recruiting crisis has increased the frequency of Guard and Reserve deployments. The frequency of deployments results in a recruiting crisis in the Guard and Reserve.

Other military non-profits, such as the Military Officers Association, are lobbying congress for improved benefits for the Guard and Reserve. Chief among them is special pay for skills like flight pay, hazard pay, Tricare to include dental, and ensure time served counts towards the Post-9/11 Gl Bill.

Of course employers must buy into the Guard and Reserve concept. Offer tax incentives to hire and retain Guard and Reserve members.
